Mawusi Kwame Dzodzomenyo Mawusi Kwame Dzodzomenyo aged 27 years , a recent graduate of The Ohio State University, was born to Samuel Dzodzomenyo and Stella Kpobi on August 18th, 1984 in Kumasi, Ghana. He is survived by sisters Emefa, Edem, Sedina, his mother, Stella and father Samuel and step-mother Eyra. He attended Adventist Preparatory School, Amakom, Kumasi. He performed exceptionally well and was admitted to Presec Legon for his secondary school education. He was admitted to The Ohio State University in 2006 and intended to become a Pediatrician. About a year to his graduation in a Premed Program he was diagnosed with cancer of the bone and muscle. Kwame had an extremely positive attitude towards his illness and never complained about the rigorous treatment he received. Despite several hospital admissions, his determination to complete college education was so strong that he obtained his Bachelor of Science degree in June 2011 whilst on admission. He was eager to go back to school but decided to take a break in October to visit friends and family in Ghana. On his return he was readmitted to the hospital due to complications. During his final hospital stay Mawusi, as usual was very jovial everyone and watched his last OSU game whilst on admission. He loved God, believed in Jesus Christ and attended church regularly (which ever he finds) . The evening before he left us he signaled his cousin Patricia, who has been with him very frequently during his illness to continue reading bible verses to him. He met his untimely death on Wednesday, November 23rd 2011. Kwame will be remembered by his

positive outlook to life,love of toys,computer , video games, friendliness and his ability to interact very easily with anybody.He was peace loving and never complained much about any difficult situation . He will be missed dearly by friends and family.
