Paul was beloved and admired by everyone who met him, old friends and new, and especially his care teams who lovingly cared for him during his medical challenges. Paul will be deeply missed by his wife of 51 years, Carol (Dustman); his daughters Ashley (Matt) Opperman and Kendra (Geoffrey) Hill; grandchildren Zachary, Ella Jean, and Emmett Paul; sister Laurel (Michael) Herbeck; and numerous nieces, nephews, and extended family members. 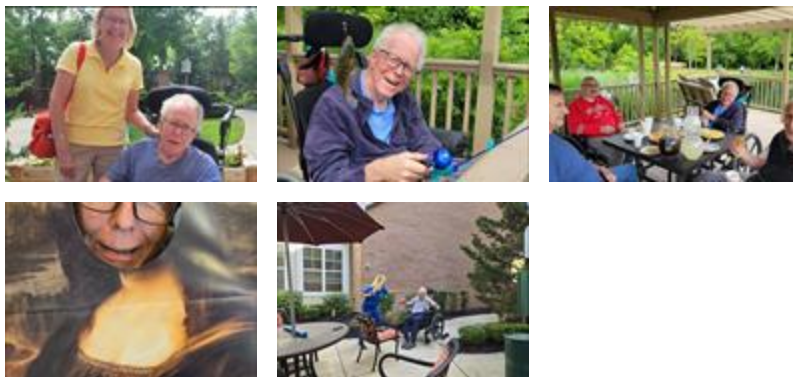
