Phyllis Ann Snedeker, 90, of Powell, Ohio passed away on Saturday, June 6, 2020. She was born to the late Fern and Elmer Loetz on July 17, 1929 in Sturgis, MI. She graduated from Sturgis High School and The University of Michigan with a Bachelor of Music degree in 1951. Phyllis was invited for 2 summers to join the Interlochen Music Camp. She taught school in East Gary, IN., Three Rivers, MI., and was a private music teacher for many years in Columbus, OH. She played professionally and received the Community Music Educator Award from the Columbus Symphony Orchestra. Phyllis was employed for 49 years at Stanton’s Sheet Music. She was a member of Overbrook Presbyterian Church since 1972. She was preceded in death by her husband of 61 years, Paul Snedeker; parents, Fern and Elmer Loetz; brother, Robert Loetz; and sister, Sharon Haws.
