Prabhat Kumar, born November 21, 1998, in Rockford, Illinois, passed away on June 1, 2026.

He is survived by his parents, Pawan and Bhavna Kumar, and his two sisters, Sonali and Mira Kumar.

Prabhat attended Olentangy Orange High school, graduating in 2016, before pursuing his passion for engineering at The Ohio State University, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering in 2021. He later completed a Master of Science in Electrical Engineering from the University of Michigan while working in the automotive industry in Detroit with Stellantis (formerly Chrysler).

Prabhat had a lifelong fascination with anything powered by an engine and set on wheels, especially cars and trains. No matter where he was headed, if he heard or spotted a train approaching, he would stop—or even turn around—just to watch it pass and hear it. His curiosity about how things worked was matched only by his appreciation for creativity and beauty. He loved movies, music, and photography, and found joy in sharing those interests with the people around him.

Music was a constant part of Prabhat's life. A dedicated violist since

childhood, he performed with numerous ensembles throughout the years, including the Youth Philharmonic of Central Ohio, the Buckeye Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Detroit Community Orchestra.

Above all else, Prabhat was a devoted son, brother, and friend. He possessed a quiet generosity and consistently placed the needs of others before his own. To his family, but especially his sisters, he was a source of unwavering support, guidance, and love. His kindness, humor, intelligence, and selflessness will be remembered by all who knew him.

Family and friends are invited to celebrate Prabhat's life on Saturday, June 6, 2026, at Rutherford Funeral Home at Powell in Powell, Ohio. Visitation will begin at 11:00 a.m., followed by a Pooja service at 1:00 p.m. A gathering for family and friends will follow (details)
