Remona A. "Ann" Fisher, 69, from Central Ohio, went home with Jesus on Easter Sunday, April 5, 2015. Ann was born April 1, 1946, in West Virginia. She was the daughter of the late O. L. "Bee" Heater and Genivee (Skinner) Heater of Orlando, West Virginia. Ann graduated from Burnsville High School in 1962 and Glenville State College in 1966. She then began a teaching career that took her to three states before settling in Columbus, Ohio in 1970 and teaching English Education at Walnut Ridge High School. She retired from full time classroom duties at Walnut Ridge in 1998. Among her numerous awards as teacher was being chosen Teacher of the Year in Columbus Schools as well as her pride in advising the production of the school newspaper for many years. Ann is survived by her husband and soul mate, Craig and sisters, Mary, Louise and Lois as well as many many nieces, nephews; great nieces and nephews, great-great nieces and nephews, and hundreds of her former students, whom she called her kids. She was preceded in death her brothers, Dale, Arnold, Jack and Joe and her sister, Maxine.
