Parsons, Robert M. "Bob", age 72, of Upper Arlington, Ohio entered the life eternal on April 10, 2017, while vacationing in Corsica. Bob graduated from The Ohio State University in 1967 and attended law school at OSU until he was drafted. He served in the Army with the First Division in Vietnam receiving the Bronze Star and Oak Leaf Cluster. He graduated from Ohio State's law school in 1972. He started work for Nationwide Insurance while in school and retired after 35 years of service in 2005.

Bob began sharing the spirit of Santa Claus for his nieces and nephews while attending OSU and continued this annual tradition with numerous family and

friends for the remainder of his life. He married Cheryl in 1976 and through her job with TWA, learned to enjoy traveling. Those travels included several mission trips including Russia. Bob served on many committees and valued the support of the Trinity family, especially their coupled group "STUMPS". Bob and Cheryl served as coordinators for the Trinity youth for many years.
