Ronald James Corn, age 70, passed away on Wednesday, January 22, 2020 at Kobacker House in Columbus, Ohio.

Ron was born on February 10, 1949 in Ironton, Ohio to Clarence Edwin (Ed) and Norma Mildred (Midge) Corn and grew up in Ashland, KY. He graduated in 1967 from Paul G. Blazer High School, where he excelled in speech and debate. After graduating from the University of Kentucky and the Ohio State University College of Law, Ron practiced law in Columbus, concentrating on pension, employee benefits, and securities law at the Ohio Department of Insurance, the Ohio Attorney General's office, the Police and Fire Disability and Pension Fund, and as Vice President at Huntington Bank.

Ron loved history, travel, and the space program, but the thing that gave him the most joy was playing with his children and grandchildren.

On January 3rd of this year, Ron and his wife, Peggy, celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. In addition to Peggy, he is survived by his children, Patrick (Megan) Corn, Allison (Aaron) Beach, brothers Tom (Judy) Corn and Robert (Kathleen) Corn, grandchildren Andrew and Margaret Corn and Kay and Charlie Beach, father-in-law and mother-in-law Roy and Mary Ward, and numerous brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law and nieces and nephews, who loved him dearly.

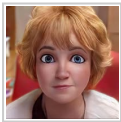
