“ RONALD HISE "Oner".

In the late 70's I was a commercial pilot and friends with a common friend of Ron's. We met annually at a July 4th Outing in Bexley, Ohio, where I learned he was a Corporate Aviation Turbo-Prop Captain for the Borden Corporation. Some years later, in 1981, I was flying the line with Ashland Oil Corp as a Corporate Turbo-Prop Captain, but yearned to return to Ohio with my family. I wrote Ron out of the blue and queried him on potential pilot vacancies with Borden. He immediately replied could he come see me. We met for an interview in Ironton, OH. In the shortest, most focused interview I have ever experienced, Ron said: Do you play golf"? Don: "I am not good". Ron: "You will learn". Ron: "Do you like Scotch"? Don: "Yes". Ron: "Would you like one"? Don: "Yes". Ron: "When can you start"? Don: "As soon as 2-weeks notice is given and with Borden's Flight Physical approval". Ron was a focused, disciplined golfer, me not so much. I must have bought Ron a million beers over the years. He was such a gentle giant and great golf coach, I never did get upset playing badly and buying the beers. We enjoyed each other's company.

His intensity for golf was unsurpassed. Shortly after Ron and I became "Real Jet" Pilots we faced our first over-water flight on a trip from Columbus, OH to the Atlantic Island of Bermuda. Not too long after our "Coast Out" over the ocean, one of our two engines failed and we entered "Emergency Mode" performing all the mandatory tasks. One hour twelve minutes later, Ron made a perfect Single-Engine landing in Bermuda. We managed to do post-flight tasks and get the replacement engine on the way. On the way to the hotel Ron said we play golf tomorrow. We played a very imposing, difficult course with a picture post card Par 3 over a Ravine with splashing waves beneath....Needless to say Ron made par on the hole and got the signed post card. I lost golf balls.

The next morning, on my veranda, I heard moaning sounds near the balcony. It was Ron calling out in pain from his room. He was down

with chest pains. I directed him to a hospital immediately, but he refused to depart until he had his free breakfast. Anyone who knows how big Ron is knows I was not in charge. He was soon in ICU on morphine in the hospital. It was Pericarditis. Ron's wife Patty was on the way to Bermuda to join him and later accompany him home after his customs medical release. Ron was never one to miss a golf round or a free breakfast.

We worked professionally at our flying jobs. Never once did Ron ever fail to take care of me throughout my career with him at Borden, He opened doors for other pilots as well. He was extremely capable and such a pleasure to be with both in the cockpit and out.

Ron, your fate was onerous later on, but you had a wonderful wife and family to tend to you. Thank you for helping me to achieve my aviation goals and a wonderful career. RIP Captain Ronald Hise. Condolences to all your family.
