Ruby (Huffman) Rogers Baird, age 101, of Columbus, passed away Monday, August 17, 2015. Born in Columbus, Ohio to the late Joseph B. and Pinkney (Wise) Huffman. After attending Columbus North High School, she graduated from the Buckeye State Business College and later worked as an administrative secretary at the Jaeger Machine Company until retirement. A lifetime member of the North Broadway United Methodist Church, Ruby also served as a volunteer at Riverside Hospital for many years. In addition, she was a member of the Delta Epsilon chapter of the PEO Sisterhood. The last two decades of her life were spent at the Wesley Glen Retirement Community where she was actively involved as a chair of the Spiritual Life Committee during the last years of her life.
