Coincidentally, her Mom was a library assistant in the Math Library at OSU at the same time that my Dad was a Math professor. Her Mom wasn't too keen on Sarah hanging out with a college student until she realized who my Dad was. We stayed friends after I went back to college and we both managed to survive the 70s. We drifted apart after I moved to Texas but reconnected later on in life when my husband happened to get a job in Columbus. I worked at the OSU Libraries while Sarah worked at Disability Services across the street and her Mom was still working at the Science Library in the early 2000s. Her Mom retired and passed away while we were there. Then her brother passed soon after we moved back to Texas. Rough times for Sarah but she hung in there with a smile and positive spirit. 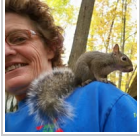

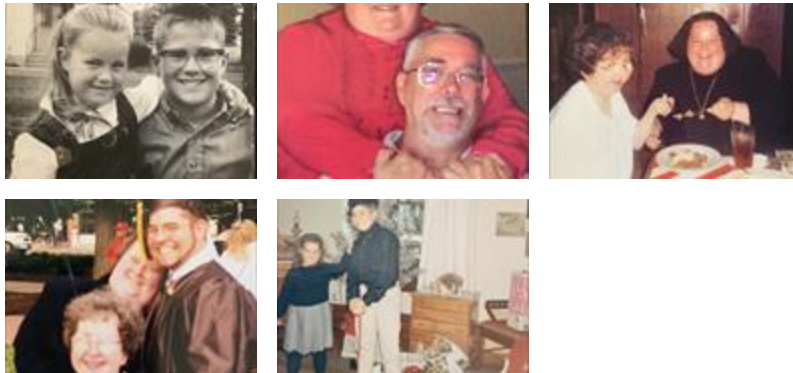
