Scooch was a valued customer at Lowes to supply his “tool world”. He never saw a tool he didn’t like! He spent countless hours dragging Howard out to get more tools! He was also obsessed with tennis shoes with over 100 pairs, most still sitting in their original boxes. And if you ever had a meal with Scooch you knew cheese would be involved! His daily Facebook posts were pictures of burgers dripping with cheese!

Scooch loved his dachshunds, Baby, Jake, Binky, Sadie and Maggie. Maggie was by his side as his beloved companion as he found himself spending more time at home throughout his illness.
