



Sgt. Bruce Alan Whittaker

August 12, 1967 - April 14, 2020

Sgt. Bruce Alan Whittaker, age 52, died April 14, 2020 following a lengthy illness. Bruce was born August 12, 1967 in Youngstown, Ohio to Robert and Joyce Whittaker. The family moved to Worthington Hills while Bruce was in elementary school, spending his formative years in Worthington, Ohio. Bruce graduated in 1985 from Worthington High School. Upon graduation, Bruce joined the Marine Corps to serve his country. Not only did he serve in Japan and Panama, but he was recalled for Operation Desert Storm and received an honorable discharge as a Sergeant in October of 1992. Bruce then attended The Ohio State University where he graduated in 1995 with a Degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice. He entered the Columbus Police Academy and graduated as President of his Class in 1999. He served as a police officer until 2010, when he was promoted to Police Sergeant. He continued to serve the City of Columbus until his death. Bruce was preceded in death by his parents, Bob and Joyce, and his sister, Robin. Bruce is survived by his soulmate, Kerry, daughter, Gabrielle, brothers Paul (Heidi), Mark (Penny), Joel (Carisa) and brother-in-law Gary Hanbaum. Nieces Molly (Cole), Zoe, Taylor, Adrienne and Shay. He loved and was loved by all of his relatives, who will miss him deeply. His loss will be felt by his many friends and his brothers and sisters in the Columbus Police Department. His caring soul, his humor and his great laugh will be missed by all. At this time, there will not be a funeral. A Celebration of Life will be planned in the future.
