Ted D. Kuhn, 61, of Dublin, died on January 24, 2008, at the OSU Ross Heart Hospital after a brief and sudden illness. Ted was married to his high-school sweetheart, Sue, and they celebrated their 40th anniversary on January 20, 2008. A graduate of Worthington High School and Indiana University's John Herron Art Institute, Ted has owned several businesses in his life including the Dublin Baskin-Robbins and Sundae Best Ice Cream in Shawnee Hills, and was currently employed as an inside salesman in the fireplace department at Hamilton Parker. Ted was a 30-year member of the Dublin Lions Club, a member of Linworth United Methodist Church where he was active in Linworth Campers and where he served on the Board of Trustees, Building Committee, and as an usher. Ted was an avid collector of automobiles. He was also an ultimate tailgater at OSU where he organized the OSU School Bus Tailgaters Club. Preceded in death by his father, Dean.
