Thomas M. Ramseyer, 59, died Thursday, January 25, 2008, at the Whetstone Care Center. He was preceded in death by his father L. Merle Ramseyer. He is survived by his mother, Marjorie Ramseyer; children, Adam (Erin) Ramseyer, Emily (Greg) Jellick and David Ramseyer; their mother, Rita Ramseyer; grandchildren, Anthony and Ava Jellick; sisters, Linda (Bill) Vahey, Jane (Dan) Hubbard, Anne (Steve) Foster and Kris (Wes) Stahler. Also survived by numerous nephews, nieces, cousins, his beloved dog, Dewey, and legions of adoring friends, neighbors, band members and feckless sycophants.
