Although Tom slipped out of our lives he was never far from our thoughts and we always hoped and prayed he would find happiness and peace. I, Chris, was employed with him at Chemical Abstracts when he worked there as an editor/analyst. I began CAS in 1990 and he was one of my first trainers. I respected his deep knowledge of the subject and his ability to help me to negotiate the ropes of the company. I will be forever grateful to him for this. I, Cindy, had the opportunity to get to know Tom, ever so slightly, through Chris and appreciated his deeply philosophical, albeit cynical, heart and spirit. We knew he had health issues because Chris often took him to his appointments, five years ago, at Riverside. Being the deeply private man that he was, he never shared any of the details of his struggles and we never pried. But our awareness of this aspect of his life, coupled with Tom's alluding to the fact that he was living on borrowed time, prompted us to think of him often and puzzle over what had become of him and how he might be progressing. Before he met you, he asked me, Cindy, if I would be willing to carry his ashes to Indonesia of all places. A very strange request. I never knew if he was serious or testing to see if I cared enough to do this favor for him. It was our experience that we often had trouble getting a read on Tom. He was one of the most enigmatic people we have ever met. We did not know he had remarried or had a son. Although we've never met, please accept our deepest sympathies for your loss.
